Ms. Demery, 5 let's just get this clear to start with. Are you speaking on behalf of the rest of the family? MS. DEMERY: Yes. THE COURT: 'Cause I -- this can't be a ten-ring 9 circus. Okay? And that is your dad there, Mr. --10 MS. DEMERY: Lionel Bouchard. 11 THE COURT: Yeah. Yes, sir. Stand up. 12 MR. BOUCHARD: Can we pose a question to the 13 family, who wants to represent dad? THE COURT: Yeah. Well, your dad can represent 15 himself. But I want to get some matters clear to start 16 with, so I just want to talk to one for now. He can have a seat. Mr. Bouchard can have a seat if he's not -- he 18 doesn't look like he's doing great, so he can sit down. Can 19 he hear anything here? 20 MS. DEMERY: Can you hear him, Dad? 21 MR. BOUCHARD: Sort of. A bit, you know. 22 THE COURT: Okay. Have a seat there, sir. Okay. 23 Let me address Ms. Legare. Okay. This is a family matter. 24 That's about all I know about it, so everybody knows right 25 off the get-go that I don't know anything. Right? 26 This is a family matter is all I know. And I 27 understand that you're -- is this all of the family here 28 29 now? All of your brothers and sisters, and your father? MS. LEGARE: No. Those are the ones that are 30 present in Manitoba only. 31 THE COURT: Okay. And I understand that they have 32 33 taken a peace bond application against you. The first

question we always ask is -- and what a peace bond is, is an

- 1 admission, there is no admission of any guilt, or anything
- 2 happening, but if you're prepared to agree, I would order
- 3 you have no contact or communication with them for the next
- 4 one-year period. Is that something you're prepared to agree
- 5 to do?
- 6 MS. LEGARE: Definitely not.
- 7 THE COURT: Okay. I thought that, from what I
- 8 could tell from the documents here. Okay. And I have Ms.
- 9 Demery up here. Okay.
- You say that your sister uttered threats to you
- 11 about a break-in at your home?
- MS. DEMERY: She's been warning us about break-
- ins, and somebody getting hurt, and aiming at the family,
- 14 and aiming at our -- just -- we're just all concerned, and
- 15 worried, and we --
- THE COURT: Well, as long as we are really clear
- on this. This is definitely not the place for this whole
- 18 mess. You are in the wrong court at the wrong time. That
- 19 is really clear, right off the get-go.
- Whether you get any orders here today, I don't
- 21 know. I already know from looking at the documents, that I
- 22 don't think orders are going to be granted at all, except
- 23 for yourself -- perhaps. And your sister, Lynda, who is
- 24 there. Right? There. Okay. The rest -- there isn't any
- 25 allegations here.
- And as I say -- and this is the last we'll talk
- 27 about this maybe for now, and maybe not at all -- you're in
- 28 the wrong court. If this is a family dispute over money,
- 29 and who has control over your father's health and well-
- 30 being, you're definitely in the wrong court, 'cause I can't
- 31 solve those disputes with any orders that I can give.
- I don't know who sent you here, how you got here,
- but it's definitely the wrong place. So I'm not going to be
- 34 able to settle any of these matters that are raised, a lot

f these matters that are raised in your Informations here today. Not at all.

3 I am not going to be able to do that at all. And I am not going to be granting orders against your sister, 4 unless I can prove either a threat, that I believe, to your 5 property -- that's why I asked about the break-in -- or a 6 threat to your personal safety. And so like I say, I don't 7 know, and I'm really not that interested, I guess, 'cause I 8 can't be, about whether you've seen lawyers or not, to sort 9 this family mess out. 10

But somebody should be seeing a lawyer to get some legal advice on this, 'cause you're definitely in the wrong place to get it sorted out. But I've got these documents in front of me, and I am prepared to deal with them.

Let's start with father first. What we'll do is we'll conduct a hearing here. Father will get up, and he'll tell me his side of the story. And I am going to limit him to telling me what physical threats his daughter has given him, has made towards him, and/or threats to damage his property.

And so Mr. Legare, could you get up and take the stand here, sir, please?

MS. DEMERY: Mr. Bouchard.

MS. LEGARE: It's Bouchard.

THE COURT: Mr. Bouchard. I'm sorry. I'm sorry.
